

Susan (Sue) Flocke, PhD is the Kaiser Permanente Endowed Professor of Evidence-based Family Medicine in the Department of Medicine at Oregon Health & Science University. Her research is focused on increasing the implementation of prevention and health promotion in the primary care setting, effective clinician-patient communication of health behavior change, and building linkages to community resources to support behavior change. For the past 24 years she has served as the PI and co-investigator of numerous NIH and foundation grants and has published over 150 peer reviewed articles. Dr. Flocke has contributed to research about teachable moments for health behavior change and has developed and tested clinician training modules to use teachable moment communication to promote tobacco cessation among primary care patients. Her current research involves using systems change and patient navigator approaches to improve patient engagement in tobacco cessation. Dr. Flocke has held several leadership positions and currently co-leads the Cancer Prevention and Control Research Program at the Knight Cancer Institute. In her spare time, she enjoys growing food, snowboarding and spending time outdoors.
